We are delighted that we have 35 pupils from Years 3-6 entered for the Bromley Festival in March. Mrs Campbell, who has a background of drama teaching, in addition to her other skills, is working with the children to learn and present their individual poems. We look forward to hearing how they all get on.

Having recently carried out an audit of drama provision throughout the school, it is clear to see that our aim of incorporating the subject across the curriculum is being fully embraced! We very much appreciate the value to all our pupils of having opportunities to present, perform and 'have a voice' in many different ways. In just the last few weeks, Year 5 enjoyed a Macbeth workshop during which they acted out scenes from the play, as well as undertaking a 'speed dating' exercise with planets in science!
