Our response should never be to do nothing and every one of us can make a difference, however small or insignificant it might seem!





SMART MOVERS

We were treated to an informative and interactive assembly delivered by our Year 6 JTAs (Junior Travel Ambassadors) Leo A and Sami T who had recently been to the annual Bromley Investiture Training where they met the Deputy Mayor. The boys introduced the latest competition to design a mascot for the 'Be Bright, Be Seen' road safety campaign. We hope they have fun judging the entries and awarding their prizes to winners in school.



They also took the opportunity to award a record number of 'Smart Mover' badges to over 50 pupils who had walked, cycled, scooted or travelled by public transport more than 10 times in September. To qualify for 'park and stride', the children need to walk for approximately 10 minutes - not from the car parked in the main road or St David's Close! This Tuesday, Year 6 girls were invited to Croydon High to play in a hockey tournament. All the girls played well, with great enthusiasm and they noticeably improved as the tournament went on. We witnessed some excellent displays of skill and outstanding teamwork. Great job, girls!

Cross country continues to flourish at St David's. From the 26th - 30th September the whole school participated in the TCS Mini Marathon event.
