

Once again, all of St David's pupils from Pre -Reception up to Year 6 took part in the annual NSPCC Number Day, raising an impressive £ 291.00 for a very worthy cause.

Some very cute penguins arrived at school and, with much excitement, "Happy Feet" filled the hall for our morning assembly. Mrs Kinnes read the story 365 *Penguins*, in which a family received a penguin



through the post every single day of the year. This inspired numerous different maths activities, based on the theme of penguins. The children sorted penguins into different sizes, divided them into groups, counted them in 2s 5s and 10s, measured time, added and subtracted penguins and generally had lots of number fun.



There was also a penguin hunt where the children had to follow mathematical clues hidden around the school in order to answer the question "How big is the current population of penguins in the world?" (see if they can remember the answer).

The day was rounded off with more fun estimation challenges in the hall: how long could Mr Hunter keep a soft toy penguin on his head? How far could Mrs Foulger throw a soft toy penguin? And how many penguin biscuits could Mr Mayes stack? It was lovely to see the children excited about numbers and enthusiastically solving mathematical problems.

## **BROMLEY FESTIVAL**

We are very excited that 55 children from Year 2 upwards have been successfully entered into the Verse-Speaking categories of the **Bromley Festival of Speech and Drama**. As soon as the organisers let us know dates and times for the classes, we will pass on the details. Thank you to all parents who got in touch to enter their child.

#### **SPORT**

Even the extreme weather this last half term hasn't stopped the children pushing themselves, learning new skills, and more importantly, having lots of fun in games and PE lessons as well as matches and their regular running sessions on our school field.

We held our annual Inter House dodge ball and football competitions for pupils from Yr 2 through to Yr 6. The children worked so well together in teams and we were delighted to see a huge improvement in their abilities in so many areas.

Each half term we time all the children, from Year 1 upwards, running either 2 or 3 laps of the cross-country course; this is proving to be a highlight for the pupils who are keen to beat their own, previous recorded time. Since Christmas, some of the staff have run the course and posted their best times, giving the children new targets to beat! Overall, seeing the determination, perseverance and pride all the children have in their running is a privilege to witness, hopefully just the process of being outside and exercising is improving both mental and physical fitness in all our pupils.

A group of our older pupils took part in the Schools Biathlon last October with three of them making the Nationals which take place in March. Massive congratulations and good luck to Jaxon, Harriet and Zac in Year 6!

Last Friday we held the annual St David's Swimming gala at Trinity school pool for our Prep children. As usual, this turned out to be fantastic evening, with a huge number of children turning up to swim and support each other in the various races. Pride does not cover what it felt like for us to see everyone have a go, from those who swim for clubs through to those who 'dug deep', literally, as they started each race in the deep end! St David's values were there on that poolside - resilience, perseverance, as well as respect and kindness as they cheered and encouraged one another. Another Inter House event, after a close start, Justin pulled away and won the House Swimming Cup this year. Well done, Justin!

The traditional Year 6 raft race was also a huge amount of fun for all involved; the teams were randomly selected in assembly the previous week with the two teams led by our Games Captains, Evan and Harriet. Seeing the children work together on the raft was both amusing and fabulous to watch.

A big thank you to all the staff and parents that came along to support and help make the event run so smoothly; such a lovely experience.





The theme of this year's Children's Mental Health Week is Let's Connect.

Assemblies were held throughout the week and we reflected on being connected to others in school, in our neighbourhood, in our country and throughout the world.

Children were asked who they had connected with and reminded that connection is not just through words but can be through eye contact, facial expressions and gestures. Children were shown how to finger breathe and reminded about what they can do when they feel disconnected from others.

At St David's, we pride ourselves on getting to know all our pupils as the unique and complex individuals they are, to endeavour to meet their needs and support them at every point of their journey through the school. All staff have recently completed training to develop our understanding of children's mental health as well as more specific training, for example dyslexia and dyscalculia.

Mrs Foulger and Mrs Handy have been attending sessions to learn more about becoming trauma informed as a school. The deepening of knowledge and understanding has been immense and helped them both appreciate why children behave and react in certain situations as they do and how we can potentially change structures and policies within school to become even more inclusive and supportive.

Discipline – comes from the latin word disciplina, meaning teaching, learning, encouraging, walking alongside... and is in no way the same as punishment, meaning to penalise, castigate and humiliate.

I hope our behaviour management and school policy reflect this understanding and will continue to evolve to meet the needs of all our pupils.

#### PARKING and PLANNING APPLICATION

As you are aware, our planning application is currently with Bromley Council as they consider the proposals and make their decision. If you have been on the planning portal you will also be aware that there have been a number of objections raised with the vast majority commenting, in very strong terms, about the traffic and parking situation around the school.

I am aware that the majority of you are doing your absolute best to drive and park in a considerate manner or, even better, have taken up an alternative way of getting to and from school. Mr King, our site manager has been relentless in his drive (no pun intended...) to eliminate bad practices and is often outside monitoring and generally observing parking.

Please do not be the parent he has to speak to; he finds it embarrassing and I am sure you do too. The flimsy reasons he is sometimes given hold no sway and would certainly not stand up in court! Whilst we are particularly mindful at the moment, the underlying and key reason for parking properly is to keep everyone safe.


