#### Pre-Reception – On the Move!

This half term Robin's class topic was 'On the Move' where we have been learning about different types of transport and vehicles. We have explored buses, trains, boats and cars. We even had Captain Harwood come in to talk about what it is like to be a pilot and fly planes. The children were inspired to go on lots of different trips using their imagination, encouraging good development of communication and language as well as storytelling.





We also celebrated the Coronation and learnt how the crown passes from one person to the next. The class made a throne and crown and we had our very own coronations.

As well as vehicles, Pre-reception are thinking about being 'on the move' to Reception.







We continue to develop our literacy skills through phonics and practising our letter formation in lots of different ways such as the sound /w/ where we 'wiggle along the worm' in paint. In numeracy we have been learning about 'more and less' leading onto addition and subtraction.

#### **RECEPTION**

WOW - What a half-term we have had in Reception!

From the children growing plants and nurturing our tadpoles to our current topic 'All Creatures Great and Small'. The children have learnt all about mini beasts, safari animals and farm animals. We have been learning about adjectives and the children have been writing sentences describing different animals. We even had an exciting visitor - Chestnut the hamster from one of our families! The children have become far more confident with their addition, subtraction and doubling facts. The children have all progressed so much in such a short space of time and we are so proud of how far they have come.





Last but not least, our amazing farm experience today which was absolutely fantastic! The children

enjoyed a real hands-on experience feeding, grooming and petting different farm animals on the field. The farmer even commented on how well behaved

and polite our children are.

# **Exploring the Rainforest**

In Year 1 we have been enjoying our very own Rainforest Adventures!

We have learned about all kinds of creatures, written about the setting of a rainforest, explored where they are in the world and our grand finale was to have a Safari in the St. David's rainforest complete with camouflage hats and binoculars! The children are so knowledgeable about rainforest creatures-ask them for some facts if you dare!

As they are camouflaged it will be hard for you to see the children in this picture but this is the whole year on safari!



We have also been learning about what conditions plants need to grow. We have been having a bean growing race in our classroom, growing cress and sunflower seeds. The teachers' seeds are losing at the moment!



# YEAR 2 - Enjoying outside learning

# In year 2 this half term we have loved taking our learning outside!

In games we have started athletics in preparation for sports day.

We have been taking our RIOT very seriously and have seen huge improvements in the children's running techniques and stamina which is also having a great impact on the children's focus in class.

In Science we have been learning about habitats, so it has been a great reason to head outside and explore habitats and microhabitats. We absolutely loved sharing our habitat homework boxes that we made with each other and asked some fantastic questions linked to what we had created.

We are really looking forward to our last half term as a team where we will be doing lots of preparation for our transition into Year 3.







#### YEAR 3 – Visit the Garden Museum

Learning all about seeds in our science topic on plants was really brought to life during our trip to the Garden Museum last week. The plant scientist at the museum showed us lots of different shaped seeds and seed pods and we were able to dissect them and use a microscope to really look closely.



"I liked learning the big words like germination, photosynthesis" and pollination" and "I loved learning the plant names in Latin!"

These were two of the comments heard after the workshop.

We found out the different ways in which seeds are dispersed before they grow into new plants and then we had a chance to look around the museum and see lots of artefacts relating to gardening through

the ages (which tied in nicely with our World War 2 history topic).

"My favourite part was looking around the museum because there was a model of a big garden with children and lots of tools and birds, but the best part was when we made a mini garden with blocks"

Not only did we visit the museum, but on the way, we were treated to the sights of London.

We saw the London Eye, Big Ben, Westminster Abbey, the Houses of Parliament and the Covid Memorial Wall.

All in all, it was an interesting but tiring day summed up perfectly by Aoife, "I just liked the fact that we were in London with school, it made me feel really happy."






## **YEAR 4 Thinking about electricity:**

This half term, Year 4 have been learning all about electricity in our Science lessons. Our topic started with thinking about the appliances we have in our homes, and why some are powered by the mains supply and others use batteries. Great fun was had considering the effectiveness of a battery powered toaster! We have been very fortunate to be able to use the brand-new circuit building kits that the school purchased recently, and the children have had great fun building their own circuits and experimenting with all of the different equipment available. The children have learnt how to build a series circuit of their own, comprising a range of components including bulbs, buzzers and motors. They can explain why a circuit may not work, and how to fix the problem. We have also looked at how circuit diagrams are drawn and the symbols used to represent the different components. We then drew some circuit diagrams of our own, remembering to use a ruler to keep our diagrams neat and tidy! Finally, we researched some scientists who are famous in the field of electricity, and made some beautiful posters to show our findings.












## **YEAR 5 Looking into Fairtrade:**



In our English lessons this term, we have been reading a book called *Cloud Tea*Monkeys by Mal Peet and Elspeth Graham. The story is set in the Himalayan mountains where women work long hours picking tea leaves and are paid very little. We then researched Fairtrade and produced our own information leaflets.

Armed with our facts and figures, we presented an assembly to the whole school on Fairtrade. We told them that... 'by giving those who make and produce food, cotton and other products fair pay, the Fairtrade Foundation helps to protect people's lives and gives them a better future.

So, choosing a fairly traded banana or bar of chocolate might not seem to make much of a difference but it's actually a really good way of helping others.





Esme set the school a challenge: 'when you next go to the shops, see how many products you can find with the Fairtrade logo'.

We found bananas, chocolate, coffee, teabags, sugar, hot chocolate, rice and flowers – only some of over 4,500 certified Fairtrade products that exist!

Swapping to Fairtrade is a good choice – but also a really easy one!

And if we all do it, then we can help to make a difference.

to their enthusiasm and determination. By the end of the day we had a gold medal, 2 silvers and a bronze.

This means that 2 of our Year 4 pupils are through to the national finals – amazing!

#### DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP

## Firstly, a plea...

We have tried to increase the number of morning clubs and they have proved to be very popular. However, it is important that the children arrive at the correct time, especially when the club involves going down to the field. The growing number of pupils that arrive late for clubs means that staff are required to escort them down which may mean leaving a meeting or them setting up activities for the day. Please also note that they should not arrive more than five minutes before the start time. Thank you.

Secondly... Following a number of comments and concerns from a variety of staff over the past few weeks, today I spoke to all the children in assembly about behaviour on the car park or at the front of school at drop-off and pick-up times. They have been informed that we expect the same standard of behaviour outside as we do when they are in school. Obviously, we need your support in this and all the staff will be carefully monitoring these areas after half-term and will have no hesitation in giving children warnings or moving them down, in line with our behaviour policy. We appreciate and anticipate your support in this area.

#### SEPTEMBER STAFFING AND CLASSES

Since I last wrote to you in March, there are a few more changes/ additions to record. Mr Styles will be leaving us at the end of term but we are delighted to say that Miss Saunders will be taking over in Pre-Reception and will carry on his funfilled, child-centered learning in her 'own style'!
